



## Midlands Engine: Annual Population Survey: Labour Market Year Ending March 2022<sup>1</sup>

#### In Summary:

- In the year ending March 2022, the employment rate in the Midlands Engine area was 74.0%, compared to 75.1% for the UK overall. When compared to the year ending March 2021, the Midlands Engine area has increased by 0.2 percentage points (pp), the UK rate increased by 0.4pp.
- The unemployment rate for the Midlands Engine was approximately 4.0% compared to 4.2% for the UK in the year ending March 2022. For the Midlands Engine, this is a decrease of approximately 1.5pp compared to the UK decrease of 0.7pp since the year ending March 2021.
- The economic activity rate for the Midlands Engine area was 77.4% compared to 78.4% for the UK in the year ending March 2022. For the Midlands Engine area, the economic activity rate has decreased by 0.9pp since the year ending March 2021. The UK decreased by 0.1pp in the same period.
- For economic inactivity, the Midlands Engine rate was 22.6% compared to 21.6% for the UK overall in the year ending March 2022. Since the year ending March 2021, for the Midlands Engine area, this has increased by 0.9pp while the UK increased by 0.1pp.

#### In Detail:

In the appendix is a table containing Midlands Engine local authority data for employment rate, unemployment rate, economic activity rate and economically inactive for the year ending March 2022 and also the change from the year ending March 2021.

#### **Employment Rate**

- In the year ending March 2022, the employment rate in the Midlands Engine area was 74.0%, compared to 75.1% for the UK overall. When compared to the year ending March 2021, the Midlands Engine area has increased by 0.2 percentage points (pp), the UK rate increased by 0.4pp.
- Within the Midlands Engine, 38 local authority areas have employment rates that are at or above the UK average (75.1%). Blaby recorded the highest rate at 85.1%, down to East Lindsey with the lowest at 55.8%.
- Since the year ending March 2021, the employment rate for 34 of the Midlands Engine local authorities increased. The highest percentage point increase in the employment rate was in Blaby by 13.1pp. In contrast, the highest percentage point decrease in the employment rate was in Wyre Forest by 15.9pp (to 66.5%).

#### **Unemployment Rate**

- The unemployment rate for the Midlands Engine was approximately 4.0% compared to 4.2% for the UK in the year ending March 2022. For the Midlands Engine, this is a decrease of approximately 1.5pp compared to the UK decrease of 0.7pp since the year ending March 2021.
- Where data is available across the Midlands Engine area, the unemployment rate varies from North Lincolnshire which recorded the lowest unemployment rate at 1.6% to Boston at 11.6%<sup>2</sup>.
- Where data is available, the highest percentage point increase in the unemployment rate was in Cannock Chase by 4.2pp (to 11.4%), in contrast the highest percentage point decrease in the unemployment rate was in Blaby by 8.1pp (to 6.7%).

#### **Economic Activity Rate**

• The economic activity rate for the Midlands Engine area was 77.4% compared to 78.4% for the UK in the year ending March 2022. For the Midlands Engine area, the economic activity rate has decreased by 0.9pp since the year ending March 2021. The UK decreased by 0.1pp in the same period.

- Within the Midlands Engine, 35 local authority areas have economically active rates that are at or above the UK average (78.4%). Blaby recorded the highest economic activity rate at 91.2%, down to East Lindsey with the lowest at 61.1%.
- Since the year ending March 2021, the economic activity rate in 32 of the Midlands Engine local authorities increased. The highest percentage point increase in the economic activity rate was in North West Leicestershire by 10.9pp (to 82.7%), in contrast the highest percentage point decrease in the economic activity rate was in Wyre Forest by 17.1pp (to 68.4%).

#### **Economic Inactivity**

- For economic inactivity, the Midlands Engine rate was 22.6% compared to 21.6% for the UK overall in the year ending March 2022. Since the year ending March 2021, for the Midlands Engine area, this has increased by 0.9pp while the UK increased by 0.1pp.
- Economic inactivity can be broken down further into reasons of inactivity. For the year ending March 2022, the Midlands Engine had a higher percentage of people that were inactive when compared to the UK in one category; student (28.2% vs 27.6%).

#### **Employment by Occupation**

• The following table shows employment proportions by occupation for the Midlands Engine and the UK for the year ending March 2022. The Midlands Engine have a higher than the UK average percentage of people employed in five of the nine occupations, these include: administrative & secretarial occupations (10.4% vs 10.3%), skilled trades occupations (9.4% vs 8.7%), caring, leisure & other service occupations (8.5% vs 8.1%), process, plant & machine operatives (7.3% vs 5.6%) and elementary occupations (11.0% vs 9.5%).
