

## UK Regional Trade in Goods Statistics: Year Ending Q3 20231; Midlands Analysis


## **Key Points:**

- In the year ending Q3 2023, the Midlands area exported £61.0bn worth of goods and imported £76.1bn. This represents a trade in goods deficit of £15.1bn, a decrease from the trade deficit in the year ending Q3 2022 which was £21.1bn.
- Goods exports from the Midlands area increased by £9.8bn (+19.0%) since the year ending Q3 2022. The UK increased by a slower rate, by 2.7% to £370.0bn.
- Goods imports to the Midlands area increased by £3.7bn (+5.1%) since year ending Q3 2022. UK-wide total imports increased by 2.2% to £611.8bn.
- The Midlands area accounted for 23.0% of England's exports which was above London (15.0%) and the South East (16.0%).
- The largest SITC section for goods exports in the Midlands area was machinery and transport at £42.5bn 69.6% of total; of which £26.1bn (61.4%) went to non-EU locations. Since the year ending Q3 2022, overall, this SITC section increased by £9.0bn (+26.9%), reflecting a recovery in the automotive sector and wider manufacturing industry.
- By country group, the highest value of goods exports from the Midlands area was to the EU at £26.9bn, accounting for 44.1% of the total. The value of goods exports to the EU has increased by £2.2bn (+9.1%) since the year ending Q3 2022.

#### In Detail:

- In the year ending Q3 2023, the Midlands area exported £61.0bn worth of goods and imported £76.1bn. This represents a trade in goods deficit of £15.1bn, a decrease from the trade deficit in the year ending Q3 2022 which was £21.1bn.
- In the year ending Q3 2023, the West Midlands exported £34.1bn worth of goods and imported £42.7bn a trade in goods deficit of £8.5bn. The East Midlands exported £26.9bn worth of goods and imported £33.5bn a trade in goods deficit of £6.6bn.

# The following chart shows the value of goods imported and exported by region in the year ending Q3 2023:





#### **Goods Exported**

- In the year ending Q3 2023, goods exports from the Midlands area were worth £61.0bn which has increased by £9.8bn (+19.0%) since the year ending Q3 2022. The UK increased by a slower rate, by 2.7% to £370.0bn.
- Since the year ending Q3 2022, the West Midlands region goods exports increased by nearly £6.2bn (+22.0%) to £34.1bn in the year ending Q3 2023. East Midlands goods exports increased by £3.6bn (+15.5%) to £26.9bn in the year ending Q3 2023.
- As seen in the chart below, there was a mixed picture for annual change across the regions. Notably, the West Midlands region had the highest annual percentage increase.
- The Midlands area accounted for 23.0% of England's exports (12.9% West Midlands and 10.1% East Midlands) which was above London (15.0%) and the South East (16.0%).

# The following chart shows UK exports by region, for the year ending Q3 2021, Q3 2022 and Q3 2023:




- Quarterly analysis shows that when comparing Q3 2023 to Q2 2023, total goods exports from the Midlands decreased by £828m (-5.3%, UK -4.0%) to £14.9bn. The West Midlands decreased by £607m (-6.9%) and the East Midlands decreased by £221m (-3.2%).
  - EU exports from the Midlands decreased by £340m (-4.9%, UK -2.2%); the West Midlands decreased by £221m (-5.8%) and the East Midlands decreased by £119m (-3.8%).
  - Non-EU exports from the Midlands decreased by £487m (-5.5%, UK -5.7%); the West Midlands decreased by £385m (-7.8%) and the East Midlands decreased by £102m (-2.6%).
- Quarterly analysis shows that when comparing Q3 2023 to Q3 2022, total exports from the Midlands increased by £1.0bn (+7.5%, UK -10.2%); the West Midlands increasing by £721m (+9.7%) and the East Midlands increasing by £320m (+5.0%).
  - EU exports from the Midlands increased by £113m (+1.8%, UK -13.9%). The West Midlands increased by £257m (+7.8%), whereas the East Midlands decreased by £144m (-4.6%).
  - Non-EU exports from the Midlands increased by £930m (+12.6%, UK -6.0%) as the West Midlands increased by £465 (+11.3%) and the East Midlands also increased by £465m (+14.1%).



## **Goods Imported**

- In the year ending Q3 2023, goods imports to the Midlands area were worth £76.1bn, an increase of £3.7bn (+5.1%) since year ending Q3 2022. UK-wide total imports increased by 2.2% to £611.8bn.
- Since the year ending Q3 2022, the value of West Midlands region goods imports increased by £1.7bn (+4.2%) to £42.7bn in the year ending Q3 2023. East Midlands imports increased by £2.0bn (+6.3%) to £33.5bn in the year ending Q3 2023.

The following chart shows UK goods imports by region, for the year ending Q3 2021, Q3 2022 and Q3 2023:



- Quarterly analysis shows that when comparing Q3 2023 to Q2 2023, total imports to the Midlands decreased by £1.5bn (-7.9%, UK -6.7%). The West Midlands decreased by £791m (-7.3%) and the East Midlands decreased by £757m (-8.8%).
  - EU imports to the Midlands decreased by £865m (-7.6%, UK -6.2%). The West Midlands decreased by £430m (-6.5%) and the East Midlands decreased by £434m (-9.1%).
  - Non-EU imports to the Midlands decreased by £684m (-8.4%, UK -7.3%). The West Midlands decreased by £361m (-8.4%) and the East Midlands increased by £323m (-8.4%).
- Quarterly analysis shows that when comparing Q3 2023 to Q3 2022, total imports to the Midlands decreased by £90m (-0.5%, UK -10.3%). The West Midlands increased by £185m (+1.9%) whereas the East Midlands decreased by £275m (-3.4%).
  - EU imports to the Midlands increased by £728m (+7.4%, UK +2.5%). The West Midlands increased by £687m (+12.5%) and the East Midlands increased by £41m (+1.0%).
  - Non-EU imports to the Midlands decreased by £817m (-9.9%, UK -22.0%). The West Midlands decreased by £502m (-11.4%) and the East Midlands decreased by £315m (-8.2%).

### Standard International Trade Classification (SITC)

The total value of goods exports in four of the ten SITC sections increased for the Midlands since
the year ending Q3 2022. The sections that increased were food & live animals, manufactured
goods, machinery & transport and miscellaneous manufactures.



- The largest SITC section for goods exports in the Midlands area was machinery and transport at £42.5bn 69.6% of total; of which £26.1bn (61.4%) went to non-EU locations. Since the year ending Q3 2022, overall, this SITC section increased by £9.0bn (+26.9%), reflecting a recovery in the automotive sector and wider manufacturing industry.
- 9.5% (£5.8bn) of goods exported from the Midlands area were manufactured goods, (of which 59.8% of the section total, or £3.5bn went to the EU). This was followed by 8.8% (£5.4bn) for miscellaneous manufactures (of which 51.0% or £2.7bn went to EU locations).
- The total value of imports in seven of the ten SITC sections decreased (and a further 1 was the same amount) for the Midlands when compared to the year ending Q3 2022. The two SITC sections that increased were food & live animals and machinery & transport.
- The largest SITC section for goods imports to the Midlands area was machinery & transport at £37.9bn, which is 49.7% of total imports (of which 59.7% or £22.6bn of imports for this section was from the EU). This section overall has increased since the year ending Q3 2022 by £5.6bn (+17.4%).
- 16.1% (£12.2bn) of goods imported to the Midlands area were manufactured goods in the year ending Q3 2023, a decrease of nearly £588m (-4.6%) since the year ending Q3 2022.

# **Country Group**

- The highest value of goods exports from the Midlands area was to the EU at £26.9bn, accounting for 44.1% of the total. The value of goods exports to the EU has increased by £2.2bn (+9.1%) since the year ending Q3 2022.
- The highest value of imports to the Midlands area was from the EU at £44.2bn, which accounted for 58.0% of the total. Goods imports from the EU increased by £4.5bn (+11.3%) when compared to the year ending Q3 2022.
- There were two Country Groups where goods exports from the Midlands slightly declined from the year ending Q3 2022, which were Eastern Europe (excl. EU) by £38m (-5.5%) to £647m and Sub-Saharan Africa by £1m (-0.1%) to £727m. While there were declines in imports to the Midlands from five Country Groups: Asia & Oceania, Eastern Europe (excl. EU), Latin America & Caribbean, Sub-Saharan Africa and Western Europe (excl. EU).
